Related medical office building.

Glidden-Durkee Plant #924, Huron, Ohio, 1971
An industrial building for the manufacture of paint.

The Federal Triangle Project, Washington, District of Columbia, 1969
Design of the Grand Plaza between 12th and 14th Streets and Constitution and Pennsylvania Avenues as well as the new Pennsylvania Avenue Annex Office Building; an addition to the Internal Revenue Services Building; a six hundred-car underground parking facility; and extensive planning, restoration and transportation coordination.

St. Mary's Hospital, Bucks County, Pennsylvania, 1968
A ten-million dollar community hospital.

The University of Connecticut Health Center, 1967
An eighty-million dollar medical school, dental school, hospital and research complex. With a floor area of one million square feet, it was at that time the largest pre-cast concrete building in the country. Apparently, it also was the largest all-electric building.

A depressed commercial and residential area project in North Philadelphia involving survey work and an in-depth study of the living patterns and marketing problems of the area followed by a comprehensive redesign of all buildings, grounds and streets.

Preliminary design of a large residential development in the Society Hill area.

1500 Walnut Building, Philadelphia
Work on a twenty-story building in Center City.

Design and production of a circular ramp parking garage.

Design and Production, residential development work.
